Kentucky ranks #1 in the nation for child abuse and neglect. *This is not acceptable*. Our children and families are facing multiple crises at once and are suffering because of it. They need our support now more than ever before.

In 2020, it was our privilege to serve 1,037 children, foster parents, and family members. St. Joe's helped children heal from their traumas, connected them to their forever families through foster care and adoption, as well as provided high-quality child care to frontline workers.


Bur Vision

For nearly two centuries, St. Joe's has continued to evolve to meet the needs of Kentucky's children and families and remains a beacon of hope in the community. However, necessary program growth due to the massive increase in demand for services, combined with aging structures that need immediate and extensive overhauls means that the time to renovate is now.

The once stoic, three-story building now houses an outdated, behemoth set of internal mechanics, faces staggering maintenance issues with escalating annual repair costs, and a 19th-century floor plan that no longer supports St. Joe's 21st-century programs. Our master plan calls for a \$23 million renovation of our facilities including renovation to our 90,000 square foot main landmark building that serves all three of our programs, renovation to the gymnasium, and constructing a new school for the children in our residential program.






residential treatment

St. Joe's Residential Treatment program cares for children who have been removed from their homes due to abuse and neglect and is licensed to house up to 48 children (ages 6-15) at a time. St. Joe's becomes an extended family for many residents and it is not uncommon for a child to say, "For the first time, I feel safe."

My staff give me hope. They have given me a path of what I can do to get out of here and not come back to a placement. They put quotes on our board that inspire me. They teach me to focus on what's ahead of me and not in the past. They are teaching me to be more mature and [showing] me what my future could hold.

Program

therapeutic foster care & adoption

Our program serves children from infancy to 21 years old who are currently placed in Kentucky's foster care system. The St. Joe's foster care and adoption team recruits and trains individuals from the community to become foster parents while also providing 24/7 support to meet the various needs of our families. We continue to facilitate one of the highest rates of adoptions of any private child-caring agency in Kentucky.









Final audit of 2020 financials.




